Declaration and Treaty of SADC

- ARTICLE 5: OBJECTIVES
- 1. The objectives of SADC shall be to:
- a) achieve development and economic growth, alleviate poverty, enhance the standard and quality of life of the people of Southern Africa and support the socially disadvantaged through regional integration;
- b) evolve common political values, systems and institutions;
- c) promote and defend peace and security;
- d) promote self-sustaining development on the basis of collective selfreliance, and the interdependence of Member States;
- e) achieve complementarity between national and regional strategies and programmes;
- f) promote and maximise productive employment and utilisation of resources of the Region;
- g) achieve sustainable utilisation of natural resources and effective protection of the environment;

RISDP – Environment & Sustainable Development

- Ensuring a coordinated regional positions in the negotiations and implementation of MEAs; and other agreements.
- Harmonization of positions and coordination of regional efforts to ensure maximum benefit for SADC member states in all MEAs; and coordination of the development and implementation of national and sub-regional action programmes and resource mobilization

RISDP

SADC has inculcates a sense of regional belonging as well as a tradition of consultation among the peoples and governments of Southern Africa, which, among other things, has improved regional security.

First Stakeholder Forum

- November 17, 2008 in Gaborone, Botswana.
- Purpose was to develop the SADC position on the UNFF8.

Functions of the Forum

- Provide advisory services to TCF on relevant issues
- Establish Task Groups on issues identified by TCF
- Assess reports from Task Force
- Follow up and report on major decisions as recommended by TCF and engage in lobbying
- Facilitate and galvanize opinions on issues from stakeholders
- Facilitate information management and dissemination
- Promote partnership and networking
- Facilitate capacity building
